Addingham Angling Association Safeguarding Adults at Risk Policy

The purpose and scope of this policy statement is to offer safeguards to adults at risk* who are Club members and to promote the following good practice:

- To safeguard and promote the interests and wellbeing of adults at risk with whom they come into contact with.
- Respond appropriately to concerns.
- Take all reasonable and practical steps to protect adults at risk from harm, discrimination, or degrading treatment.
- Respect and promote adults at risk's rights, wishes and feelings.
- Make informed and confident responses to adults at risk issues.

Responsibilities of Club members

Club members have a duty to understand their responsibilities with regard to adults at risk issues:

- Allow adults at risk access to the sport in a way that is appropriate for their ability.
- Do not subject adults at risk to any form of abuse from any source.
- Do not subject adults at risk to bullying or undue pressure from any source.
- Encourage adults at risk to achieve their full potential at all levels.
- Afford adults at risk respect, confidentiality and privacy in the angling environment.

We will seek to keep adults at risk safe by:

- Valuing, listening to and respecting adults at risk.
- Appointing a nominated Welfare Officer for adults at risk.
- Adopting adults at risk safeguarding best practice through our policies and procedures.
- Informing Club members about their roles and responsibilities in safeguarding adults at risk.
- Ensuring that appropriate action is taken in the event of an incident or concern and provide support for the individual or individuals involved.
- Recording and storing and using information professionally and securely, in line with data protection legislation and guidance.
- Reviewing and adapting policies and procedures as required.

Whistleblowing

It is important that Club members have the confidence to come forward to speak or act if they have concerns about how adults at risk issues are handled. If you have a concern about an adult at risk in the Club, always talk to the Club Welfare Officer.

Legal framework

This policy has been drawn up on the basis of legislation, policy and guidance that seeks to protect adults at risk in England.

Annual Review

This policy will be kept under review at all times, and will be subject to review by the Club Committee annually, on or before 28 February.

*An adult at risk is a person who is over 18 years and at risk of abuse or neglect because of their needs for care or support.
